The Situation: Challenges

- Lack of inter and intra agency coordination
- No uniform classification of concepts and indicators
- Lack of culture using data and statistics informing policy-making or performance
- No legal authority
- Youth*

Initial Steps: Identifying Needs

- Comprehensive pic of CJ process in Thailand
- Agencies no longer working in isolation
- Agency-wide uniform concepts and measurements
- Data and statistics that inform policy successes and shortfalls
- Dissemination of research and data to several audiences: general public, policy-makers, academics etc.

Initial Steps: TIJ Goals and Priorities

- House and maintain Thailand's only crime and justice statistics database
- Link CJ agencies domestic and international
- Conduct research projects independently and with other CJ agencies
- Promote international standards and best practices
- Promote uniform crime classification standards
- Promote data and statistics-driven criminal justice policies

The Political: Fostering Relationships

- Crafting MOU w/ all domestic CJ agencies add value:
- Share, process and publish data
- Joint capacity-building trainings
- Joint-research projects—CVS, performance indicators, trends analysis, etc.
- Next year: Networking with domestic and international NGOs
- Work w/ CJ agencies to link data to policy planning and evaluation
- Developing CJ indicators

The Technical: Dissemination

- Currently purchasing technology for storing, processing and publishing data and statistics
- Currently preparing TIJ website for publication of data and statistics in user-friendly format
- Periodic publication on basic CJ stats: Stats in Brief
- Establishing presence domestically and internationally: e.g. Bangkok Dialogue on the Rule of Law, UNODC, conferences like this 😊
