PhD (University of Toronto), is University Professor, CIHR/PHAC Applied Public Health Research Chair, and Director of the Centre for Applied Research in Mental Health & Addiction (CARMHA), Faculty of Health Sciences & School of Criminology, Simon Fraser University, Vancouver, Canada.

He also holds an appointment as a Senior Scientist, Social Epidemiological Research, Centre for Addiction and Mental Health (CAMH), Toronto, and Professor (status), Department of Psychiatry, University of Toronto. Dr. Fischer is an internationally leading researcher in the areas of the epidemiology of psychoactive substance use, key co-morbidities (including mental health and blood-borne viruses) and evidence-based prevention/treatment and public health interventions, with active research collaborations in North & South America as well as Europe. His research focuses on general and marginalized (e.g., young people, correctional, homeless) risk populations, draws on multi-disciplinary methods, and includes substantive knowledge translation into policy and practice. Dr. Fischer actively consults with governments and non-governmental agencies nationally and internationally. He is widely published in his areas of research interest. Until recently, he served as a member of institutional advisory boards for both the Canadian Institutes of Health Research as well as the Mental Health Commission of Canada. He is an Associate Editor of the International Journal of Drug Policy.
