Professor Tim Hope, Ph.D., holds the Chair in Criminology, University of Salford, Manchester, UK. He has also held positions at Keele University; University of Manchester; University of Missouri-St. Louis MO, USA; and CACI Ltd. He has been Visiting Senior Research Fellow, Scottish Centre for Crime and Justice Research, University of Edinburgh, and Director of Crime and Social Order Research Programme of the Economic and Social Research Council. He was Principal Research Officer responsible for social and community crime prevention at the Home Office Research and Planning Unit, where he also worked on the first generation of the British Crime Survey.

He has been an expert consultant to the UK Statistics Commission, Home Office, The UK Police Foundation, Audit Commission, the International Centre for the Prevention of Crime (IPCC), the European Forum for Urban Safety (EFUS), the Regional Government of Emilia-Romagna, Italy, the Czech Republic, the European Commission evaluation of the European Crime Prevention Network, and a coordinator in the CRIMPREV Co-ordination Action of the European Union Framework Programme 6. Currently he is a consultant to the INEGI-UNODC Centre of Excellence in Statistical Information on Government, Crime, Victimization and Justice, Mexico City.

Professor Hope has authored more than 100 research publications, including peer-review journal articles, both in the UK and also in the USA, Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Belgium, The Netherlands, Czech Republic and Poland, with some works appearing in translation. He is on the editorial boards of Safer Society, Criminal Justice Matters, and the European Journal of Policing Studies.
