



## **Luis Carlos Ugalde**

Has taught political science and has been a researcher at several universities in Mexico and the United States, including the Autonomous Technological Institute of Mexico (ITAM), the Center for Economic Research and Teaching (CIDE), Harvard University, Georgetown and Americana University in Washington, D.C.

He was the main advisor of the Federal Electoral Institute (IFE) from 2003 to 2007. His experience was reflected in his book *Así lo viví: Testimonio de la elección presidencial de 2006, la más competida en la historia moderna de México*, a best seller. In 2012 he published *Por una democracia eficaz*, which explains the few achievements of pluralism and alternation of power in Mexico.

He has published dozens of academic articles and opinions in specialized magazines and newspapers in Mexico and abroad. He is the host of *Periférico 1313*, a TV program on political analysis. He also serves as editor in the newspaper *El Financiero* and is also a commentator on various radio news programs. In 2011 he was part of the International Forum for the Study of Democracy, based in Washington DC, a global pioneer center to analyze and discuss the theory and practice of democracy.

Luis Carlos Ugalde has a degree in economics from ITAM, a Masters degree in Public Administration and a PhD in political science from Columbia University in New York. He was born in Mexico City.
