Dr. Zhang has published two books on human smuggling/trafficking related topics: Chinese Human Smuggling Organizations—Families, Social Networks, and Cultural Imperatives (Stanford University Press, 2008) and Smuggling and Trafficking in Human Beings: All Roads Lead to America (Praeger, 2007). He edited/co-edited two special volumes on research on human trafficking: (1) Global Perspectives on Sex Trafficking (Crime, Law, and Social Change vol. 56, 2011), (2) (co-edited with Ron Weitzer) special issue on human trafficking research for The ANNALS of the American Academy of Political and Social Science. His research has led to numerous publications in journals as Criminology, British Journal of Criminology, Crime, Law and Social Change, and Global Crime.
