

National Technical Meeting on the Measurement of Illicit Financial Flows (IFFs) related to Smuggling of Migrants

The international commitment to countering IFFs is reflected in indicator 16.4.1 of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDA), which measures the total value of inbound and outbound illicit financial flows. This indicator was defined to significantly reduce illicit financial and arms flows, strengthen the recovery of stolen assets and combat all forms of organized crime by 2030.

As the custodian agency of this indicator, the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC), through the Center of Excellence (CoE) for Statistical Information on Government, Public Security, Victimization, is developing a pilot measurement of FFI related to criminal activities to test a methodological framework in four selected countries - Colombia, Ecuador, Mexico and Peru - during the period 2019-2020.

This meeting took place within the framework of the Inter-sectoral Roundtable No. 3 of the Inter-institutional Coordination Committee for the Prevention of Trafficking in Persons, Smuggling of Migrants and Protection of its Victims.
