

STARTING POINT

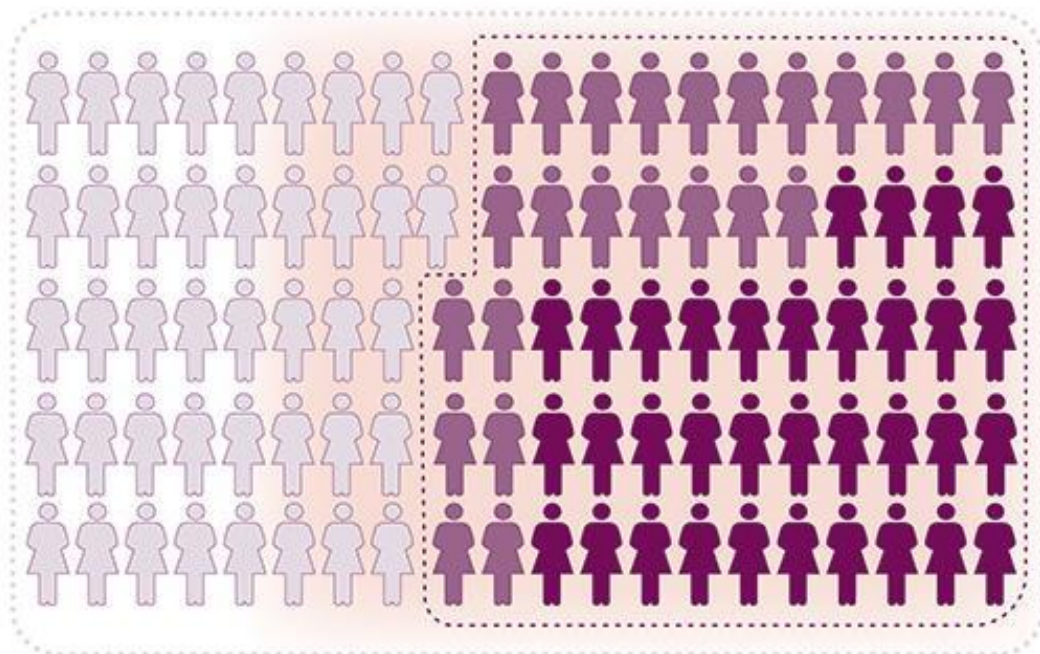
- The current international standard for crime statistics is the **International Classification of Crimes for Statistical Purposes (ICCS)**.
- Countries are still in the process of **fully adopting** the ICCS and produce **disaggregated data** in line with its various variables.
- Furthermore, the ICCS has areas of opportunity regarding the full coverage of the **gender motivation of crime** and the **gender-related context**.



The ICCS defines **Intentional Homicide** as the “Unlawful death inflicted upon a person with the intent to cause death or serious injury”. Femicide/ Feminicide falls into this category.

HOMICIDE DISAGGREGATION

- An initial approximation to the gender-related killing of women and girls (femicide/feminicide) is the measurement of killings by intimate partner/family member. But this is only a subset of the whole phenomenon, further disaggregation is needed.

UN COMMON APPROACH

- 33 gender-related criteria operationalized in disaggregating variables and categories, open to discussion by data producers, practitioners and policy-makers

context

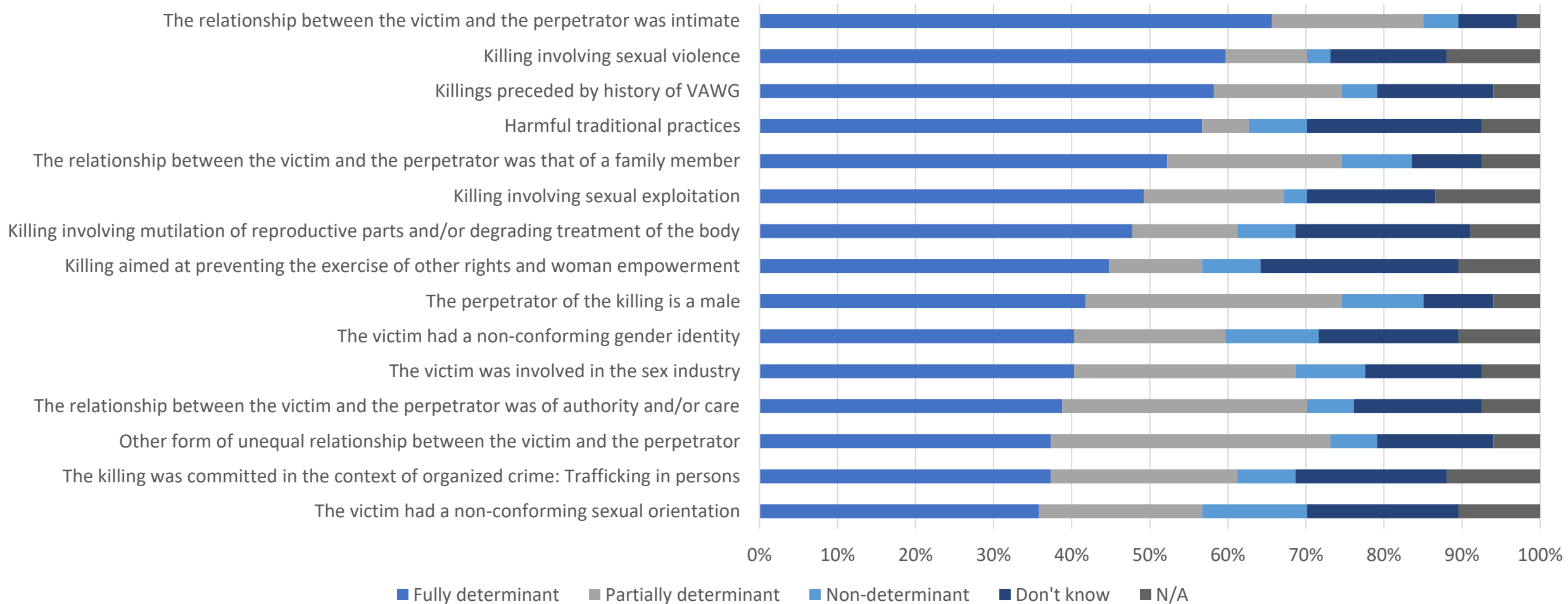

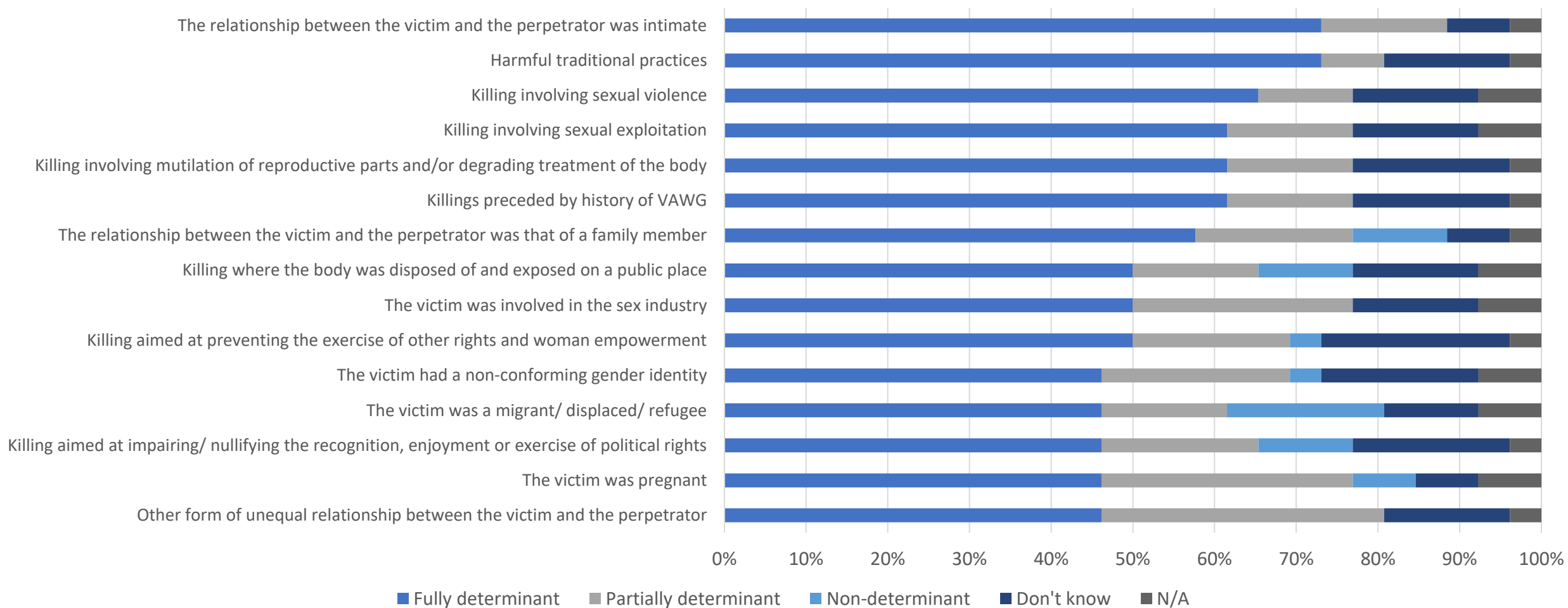
VALIDITY OF CRITERIA (ALL INSTITUTIONS: TOP 15)

Is the proposed criterion determinant to identify the gender motivation of the crime?



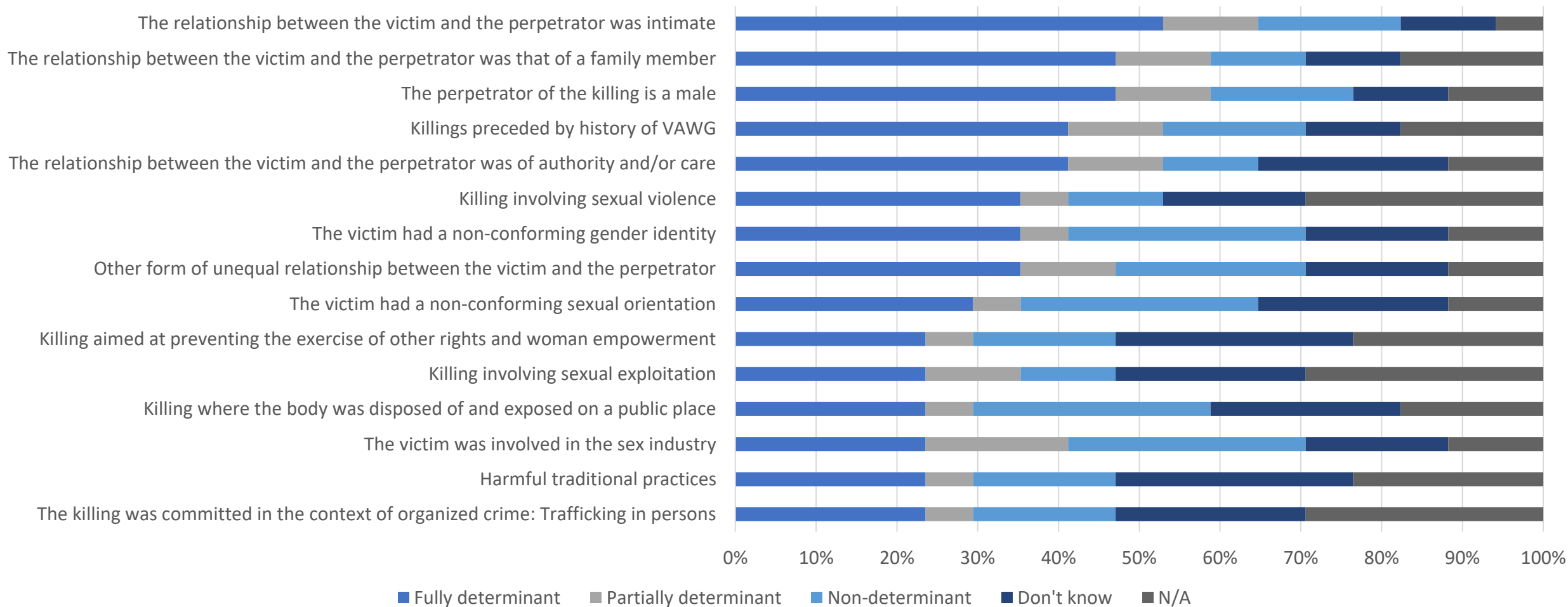
VALIDITY OF CRITERIA (NSO'S: TOP 15)

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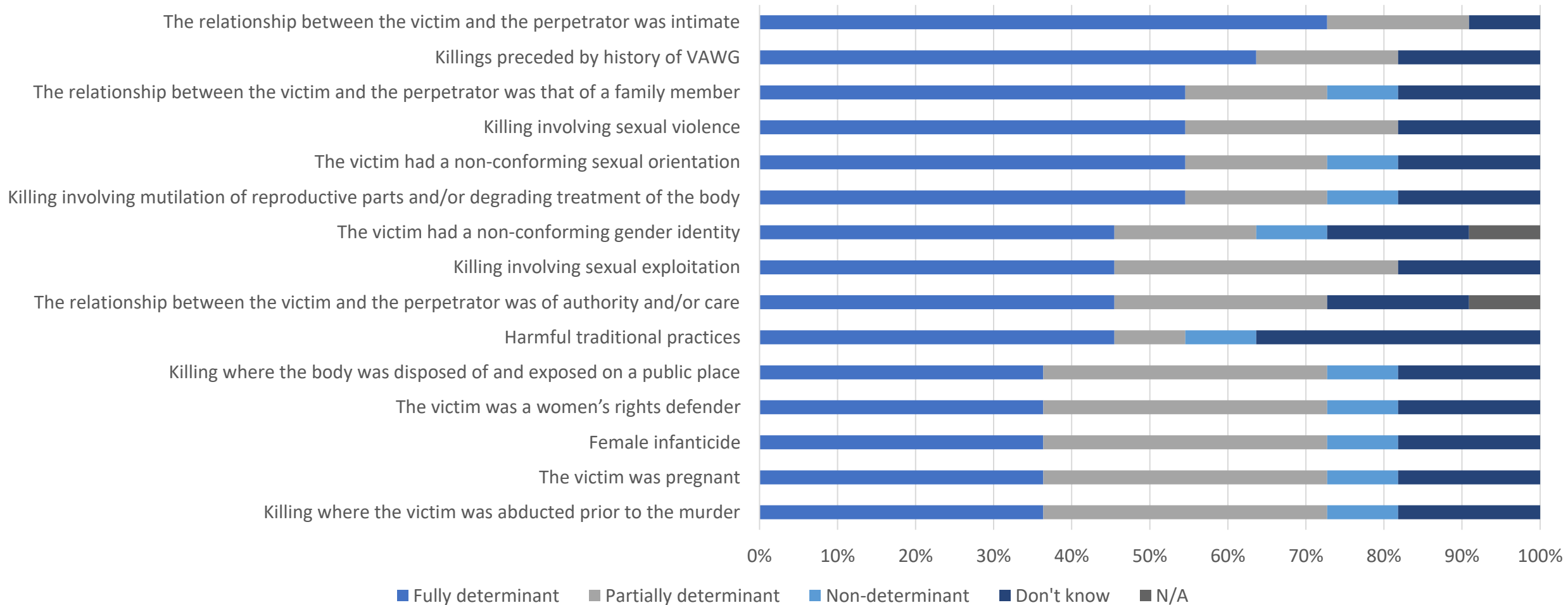
VALIDITY OF CRITERIA (POLICE & INTERIOR: TOP 15)

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DATA AVAILABILITY (ALL INSTITUTIONS: TOP 15)

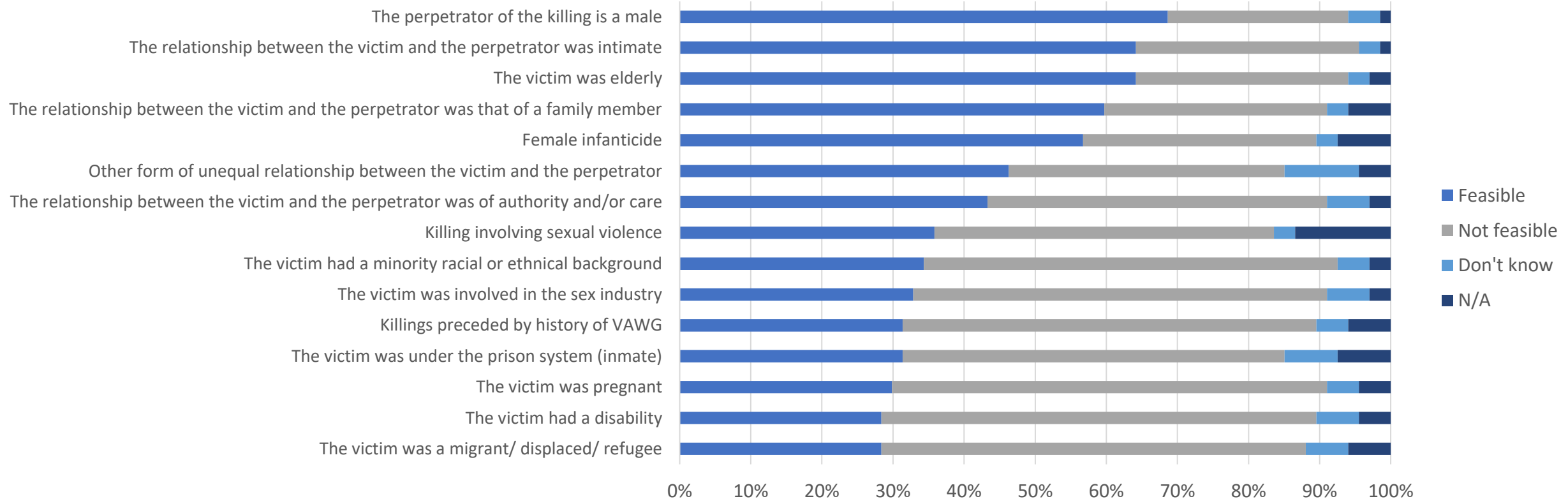
Are data according to this criterion currently collected/produced in your institution?

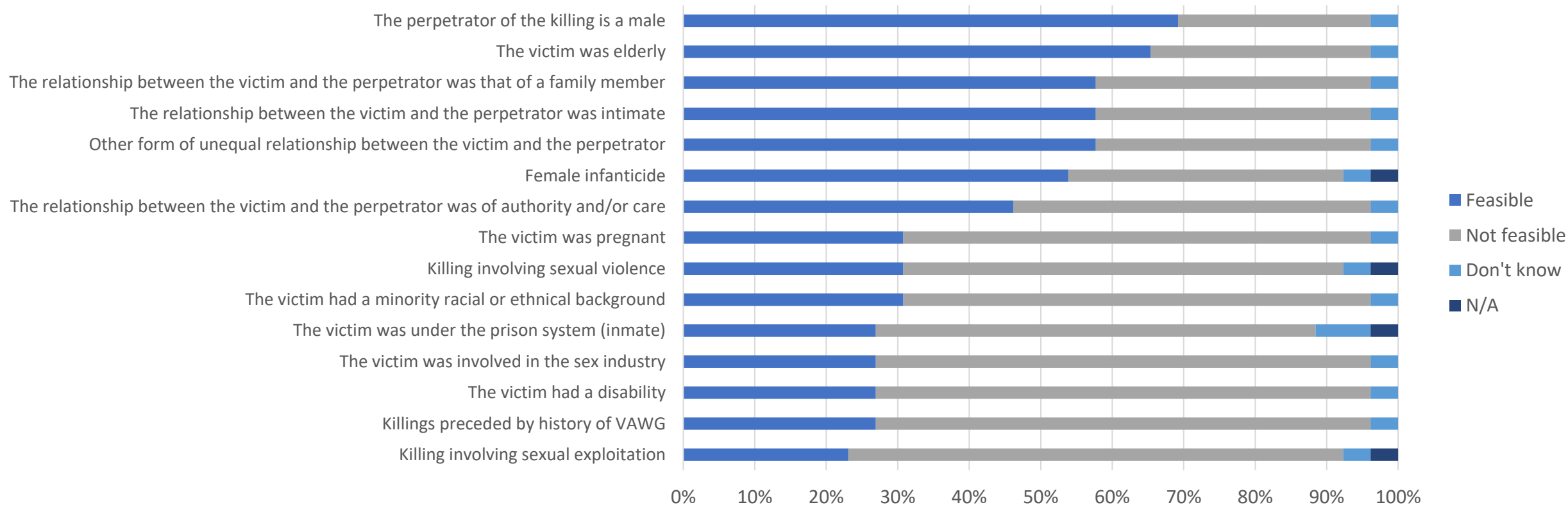
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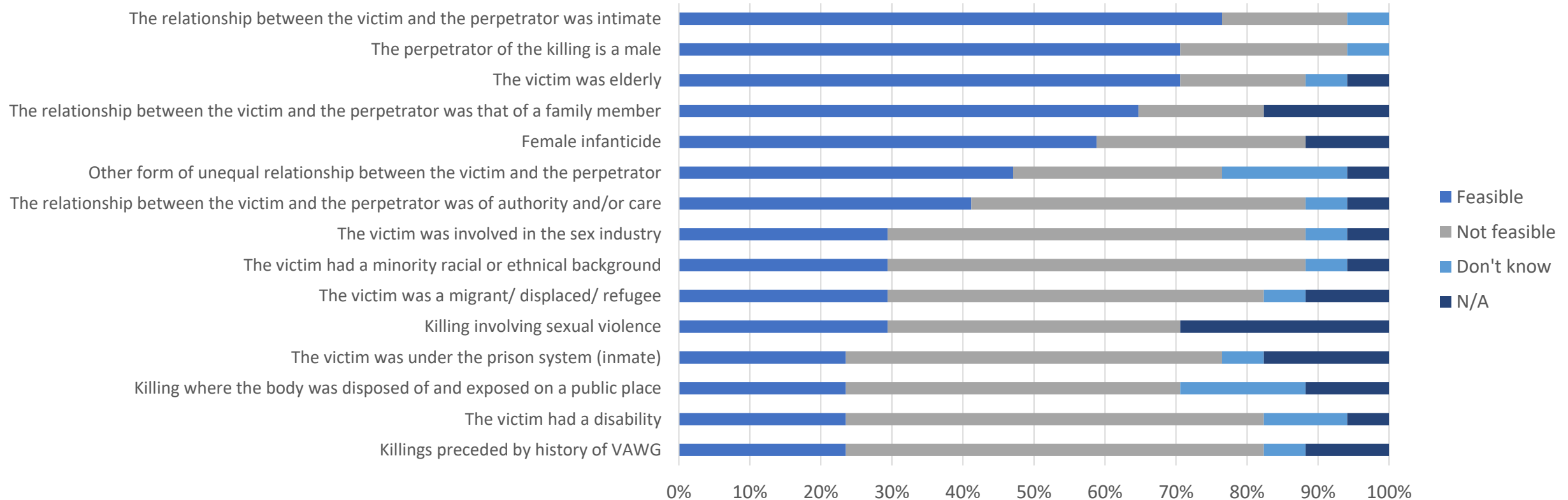
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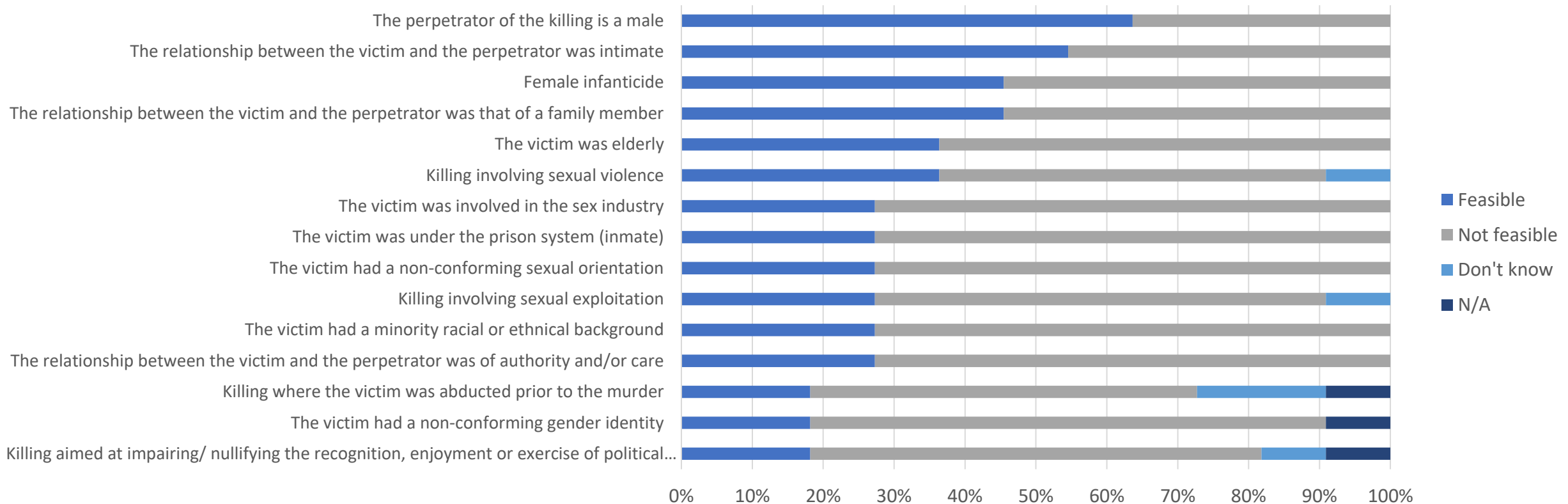
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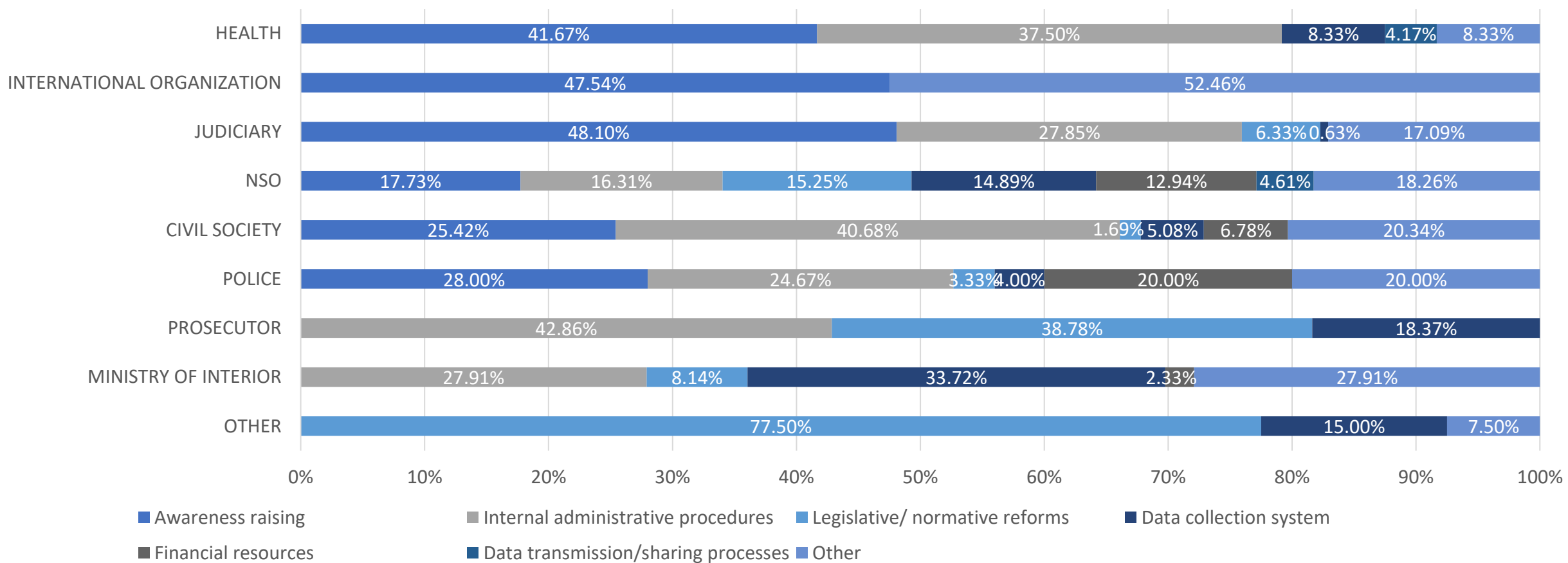
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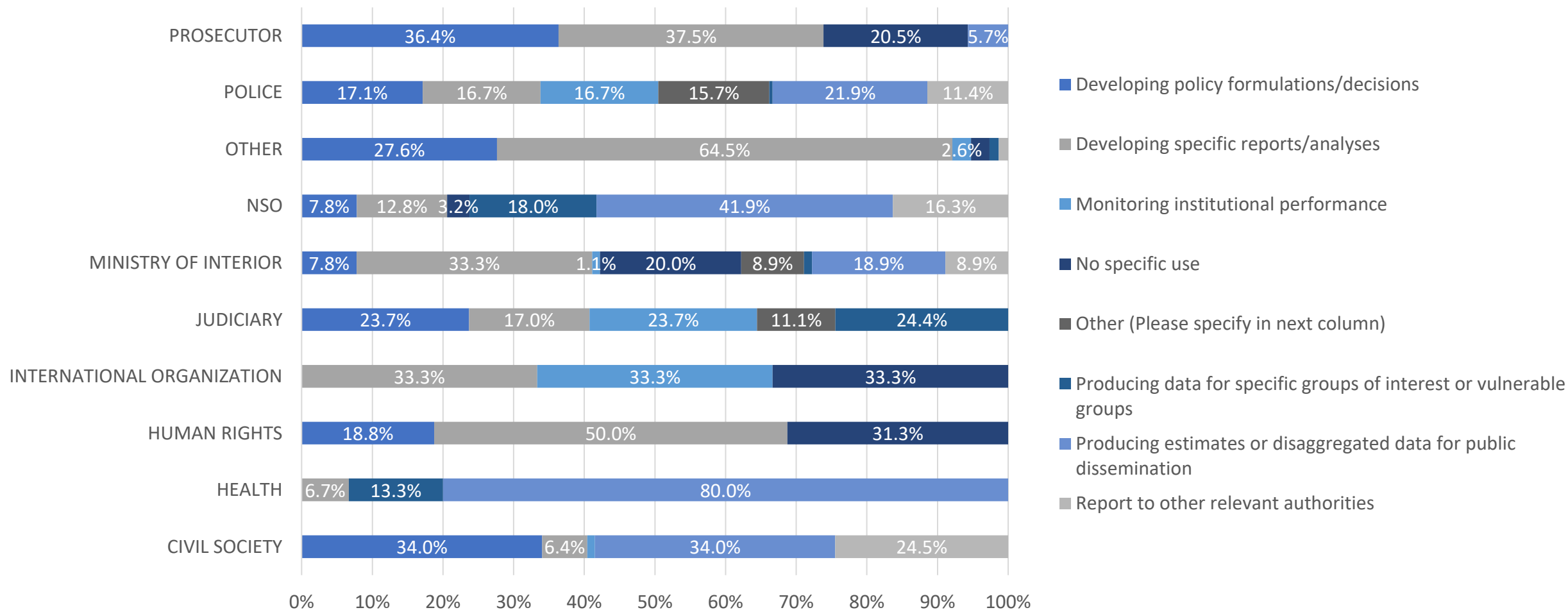
CHALLENGES (ALL INSTITUTIONS: TOP-MOST)
